NURS 501 Introduction to Advanced
Nursing Roles**

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This first semester course is designed for the entry level MSN graduate student with a focus on the introduction to the advanced nursing roles of nurse educator, nurse administrator, and informatics nursing specialist. Students will explore their selected specialty focus through readings, research, and reflective and scholarly writing. Nursing theory and nursing knowledge development will be introduced and applied to advanced nursing roles. Portfolio development will be initiated for completion during the remainder of the program.

3 credits (3+0) 3 lecture hours / week = 45 hours / semester

Pre-requisite: Admission to the MSN Program

COURSE OUTCOMES:

1. Examine the advanced roles of master's prepared nurses. (Specialty leadership role practice)
2. Utilize resources to support scholarly writing, presentations, and discussion. (Scholarship for practice)
3. Explain the development of knowledge as a basis for professional and advanced nursing roles. (Theoretical base for practice)
4. Discuss the relationship of theory to nursing research and practice for nurses in specialty practice roles. (Health care environment)
5. Establish professional goals for own specialty role growth and development. (Professionalism)

Assignments earning a "C" grade will be of acceptable quality, reflecting familiarity with course material. They might contain weaknesses in organization and errors in syntax, grammar, or APA format. A "C-" grade might result from more severe weaknesses.

Assignments earning below a "C-" are unacceptable and will receive no credit.
