Articulation Agreement & Transfer Guide

The Bachelor of Science (BS) in Business degree in Hospitality Management is one of the oldest and most respected hospitality management programs in the region and has thousands of successful alumni that are employed worldwide. The Hospitality Management degree is one of only a few in the country that is housed within a College of Business that is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP). ACBSP is one of the premier organizations supporting, celebrating, and rewarding teaching excellence in business education.

## **New Student Admission Requirements**

## SAT Scores

- 2.50 High School GPA (on a 4.00 scale)
- Two of the Three Criteria:
  - 1. ERW SAT score of 450 or higher.
  - 2. Math SAT score of 500 or higher. Placement in MATH 109 or 110 will be considered (Math SAT score of 480 or higher).
  - 3. Composite SAT of 900 or higher.

## ACT Scores

- 2.50 High School GPA (on a 4.00 scale)
- Two of the Three Criteria:
  - 1. English ACT score of 16 or higher.
  - 2. Math ACT score of 19 or higher.
  - 3. Reading ACT score of 19 or higher.

## **Transfer Student Admission Requirements**

- Combined college or university GPA of 2.35 (on a 4.00 scale) from all institutions attended. GPA based on completion of 12 credit hours or more. Developmental courses will not be considered in computing the GPA requirement.
- Transfer equivalency for Ferris State University's ENGL 150 or placement during the first semester at Ferris State University which would require an English ACT score of 16 or higher; or ERW SAT score of 450 or higher; or English Accuplacer score of 6 or higher.
- Transfer equivalency for Ferris State University's MATH 114 or 115 or placement during the first semester at Ferris State University which would require a Math ACT score of 19 or higher; Math SAT of 500 or higher; or Math Accuplacer scores: Elementary Algebra score 75 or higher and College Level Math 0 to 49.

Ferris State University will articulate and award 12 credits of HSMG 3-- Hospitably General Credit at 300 Level awarded upon proof of successful completion of Department of Labor Lodging Manager Apprenticeship 11-9081-00 and American Hotel & Lodging Educational Institute's Supervisory Skills Builders. Students would be enrolled in the Lodging Management Concentration and use 9 credits of directed electives and 3 credits as substitution for MGMT 373.

As the American Hotel & Lodging Educational Institute has no general education courses, the following requirements for the Hospitality Management (HSMG) BS degree will need to be taken at Ferris State University or the equivalent at another college or university.

Communication Competency Requirements – COMM 105 or COMM 121, ENGL 150, ENGL 211 or 250, and ENGL 325.

Quantitative Literacy Requirements – MATH 114 or 115 or Official Pre-2016 Math SAT Score of 560 or Higher, Official Post-2016 Math SAT Score of 580 or Higher, or Official Math ACT Score of 24 or Higher

Natural Sciences Competency Requirements - Two courses are required with a minimum of 6 credits; must have at least one lab course.

Culture Competency Requirements - 9 credits from two subject areas, with at least one course at FSU 200 level or higher

Self and Society Competency Requirements - ECON 201 and ECON 202, and 3 additional credits

## Ferris State University General Education Program

Students are encouraged to work with an advisor to select appropriate general education courses

Additional General Education Requirements - These courses are additional General Education courses to meet the requirements for this specific program. Hospitality Management degree students must complete **39** General Education credits to meet College of Business and University Requirements.

## Diversity Competency - 2 Courses Required

If not met by courses taken for Culture, Self and Society, or MTA, a student must meet the following:

- 1 course with the Global Diversity attribute
- 1 course with the U.S. Diversity attribute

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The following College of Business Requirements (81 Credits) will need to be taken at Ferris State University or the equivalent at another college or university. A minimum of 30 credits must be earned from Ferris State University to meet the Residency requirement.

## **Articulation Agreement**

## Effective Dates: January 1, 2021 – January 1, 2024

This Agreement shall commence as of January 1, 2021 and shall be for an initial term of three years. Minor updates to the agreement may be made during this time. This agreement may be renewed at the end of three years. Either party may terminate this agreement by providing the other party with written notice of the intent to terminate the agreement. The agreement shall terminate not less than one hundred eighty (180) days from the date of the termination notice, unless otherwise agreed in writing by both parties.
