### **Moving Ferris Forward Globally**

The Office of International Education has been working on several components that have contributed to a global ecosystem. The components are:

- BEYOND Initiative which was started in 2012
  - Faculty Engagement/ Innovation
  - Networking, exploration, partnership development
- Lighthouse Symposium Series, started in 2013
  - Professional Development/Program Development
  - Benchmarking and branding

- Networking and partnership development
- Micro-campus summer program, series started in 2013
  - Study abroad/Program development
  - Interdisciplinary and innovation
  - Professional development and partnership development
- GC3 Program, started developing in 2014
  - Three-year program, equivalent to 18 credits of co-curricular experiences
  - Study abroad/Global Competency/Professional Development
  - Community Engagement and Strategic Partnership Development

As part of the 2019-2024 Ferris Forward Strategic Plan a Comprehensive Internationalization Plan is listed as a strategy for student success. The goal of the plan is to strengthen the global ecosystem to be sustainable, innovation-driven, and a differentiator for Ferris.

The question for today's SPARC group is: Building on the global ecosystem that has been developed over the past decade, how can we create innovative solutions to address our challenges?
