

The Swan Annex expansion and renovation creates the Centers for Welding Excellence and Advanced Manufacturing, with project completion in August 2018.

Ken Janke Sr. Golf Learning Center

Future Home of the Michigan Golf Hall of Fame

Currently under construction and expected to be completed by early 2019, this facility will feature 10,000 square feet of space that includes state-of-the-art TrackMan golf technology for Ferris' PGA Golf Management students and visitors, three indoor/outdoor heated hitting bays for year-round use, an indoor putting green, and space to house the new permanent home of the Michigan Golf Hall of Fame.



DOCTORATE IN COMMUNITY COLLEGE LEADERSHIP

Continued program expansion with new site established in Texas



Twenty-two students began their journey to becoming key administrators in higher education as members of the first cohort pursuing Doctorate in Community College Leadership degrees from Ferris State University at Lone Star College's University Center campus in The Woodlands, Texas.

OPPORTUNITY: Ferris, with a focus on developing career skills and knowledge, provides opportunities for civic engagement, leadership development, advancement, and success.


NOWALWAYS The Campaign for FERRIS STATE UNIVERSITY

On Nov. 9, 2017, the University publicly launched Now & Always: The Campaign for Ferris State University, the university's first comprehensive fundraising effort in its 133-year history. The multi-year campaign aims to engage alumni, friends, and other supporters to raise \$80 million to advance three major priorities: Investing in Students, Program Expansion and Innovation, and Building Partnerships. To date, \$68 million has been raised toward these priorities.

Jim Crow Museum of Racist Memorabilia

Received national publicity during 2017-18

Watermelons, Nooses, and Straight Razors: Stories from the Jim Crow Museum, written by Dr. David Pilgrim, vice president for Diversity and Inclusion, was published in 2017.

Vice News, which airs on HBO, came to campus to interview Dr. Pilgrim and produce a segment on the Jim Crow Museum of Racist Memorabilia. The segment aired on March 23, 2018, and has been viewed more than one million times on YouTube.

On May 16, 2018, Dr. Pilgrim participated in a Facebook live event hosted by *The New York Times*, which focused on Childish Gambino's (Donald Glover) music video "This is America."

Dr. Pilgrim, along with Eric Deggans, NPR's TV critic and Julia Craven, a race and black culture writer for HuffPost, shared thoughts with viewers about the video and the surrounding discussions of race and gun violence in America.



On June 5, 2018, 150 backpacks filled with school supplies and summer learning activities were delivered to Kent Hills Elementary School in Grand Rapids to celebrate the students' Fifth Grade Promotion ceremony. The backpacks were provided by guests, sponsors and supporters of the recent Growing Opportunity: A Partner Celebration event that honored Grand Rapids Public Schools.

Other partnership highlights include: KCAD's partnership in the creation and development of the Grand Rapids Public Museum School; enhanced opportunities for the Latino and Asian communities of West Michigan, particularly through college-readiness summer programs such as Promesa Advancemos for middle and high school students; and the newly created Teacher Cadet Program, which aims to recruit talented students to the teaching profession.

Student Recreation Center Renovations


Renovations are underway and will be complete in August 2018
