THE RESIDENCY POLICY- WHAT IT MEANS FOR YOU

Ferris State University's residency policy states all students who have not reached the age of 19 prior to September 1st of the current academic year will live on campus and have an anytime meal plan. We believe in being a residential community. Living on campus provides you the resources you need to achieve success here at Ferris State. **Every hall** has laundry, a kitchenette, and a study room(s). All rooms are furnished except apartments. Single halls are generally quieter than doubles.

Break housing is available in North Bond and South Bond Halls. Residents may choose to stay in their rooms in those halls during Winter Break, and Spring Break for an additional fee. when they sign up through their MyHousing in advance. Suites and apartments remain open during breaks and offer academic year or year round living options.
